SHCAC – Work Party & Litter Picking Risk Assessment 12/03/2025

This risk assessment acts as a <u>guide</u> to outline some of the common hazards, risks and control measures that might be encountered whilst undertaking a clean-up event or work party where participants are volunteers.. Due to changing weather and water conditions, ideally this risk assessment should be undertaken on the day of the event prior to it commencing.

Before undertaking a clean up or work party, make sure that you have permission of the landowner.

All participants should be briefed by the leader on the risk assessment before the start of the clean-up or work party.
